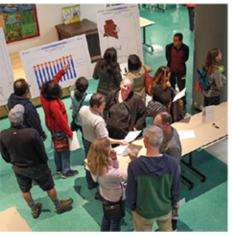

2024 School Planning

The purpose of this meeting is to:

How is Our School Development Plan Used?

- Guides ongoing assessment and review of goals and actions.
- Our school development plan is the driver for closing learning gaps and informs:
 - Instructional strategies
 - Professional learning
 - School structures and processes for learning
 - Resources to improve student learning
 - Data-informed decision making





School Development Plan – Literacy

- English Language Arts and Literacy: Improve writing through a focus on idea generation and organization.
- Literacy Routines: explicit connections between reading and writing, use graphic organizers and/or genre structures and mentor texts, conference with students and use effective rubrics.
- Professional Learning: New curriculum sessions (K-6), science of reading: encoding/decoding, assessment and reporting, HLAT (GR1&3) and Literacy Framework.
- Structures: Professional Learning Community, Collaborative Response Model, Student Learning Teams, Grade Group Planning and Data Captures.







School Development Plan – Mathematics: Number Sense

- Math: Improve fluency of number sense through conceptual understanding.
- Math routines: problem solving through open-ended questions on number, participate in number talks/math discourse, games and practice over time to represent understanding in varied modes, access to math resources to support routines (manipulatives, vocabulary, MathUp, etc.)
- Professional Learning: Math Up & subscription for each teacher. Math Framework and New Curriculum
- **Structures**: Professional Learning Communities, Student Learning Teams, Grade Team Planning and data captures.







School Development Plan – Well-Being: Respect

- Well-being: Students' skills to support the well-being of self and others (respect towards self and others) and how that impacts learning and relationships.
- Professional Development: Well-being Framework, Bullying Awareness and Prevention Framework and Indigenous Education Holistic Lifelong Learning Framework
- **Routines**: Welcoming, caring, respectful and safe learning environments, Glenmeadows TRC, certificates, PEW curriculum, acknowledgements, belonging and holistic framework (respect).
- Structures: Continuum of supports, Student Learning Teams, Area Learning Requests and Grade Tea Planning





School Development Plan – Additional Program of Study

- Spanish Language Arts: Speaks to communicate information and ideas.
- Professional Development: Neurolinguistic Approach (NLA) to increase oral language output.
- Routines: NLA in literacy loop and announcements and certificates.
- Structures: Grade group planning and student learning team.

- Our school received \$2,480,304 in 2023-24 to provide a quality education to our students and meet the goals in our school development plan (SDP).
- At least 75 per cent of budgeted funds covers staffing and the remaining portion covers instructional and operational supplies.


