#### **Who Can Register**

- Children entering kindergarten or Grade 1 can register.
- Previous Spanish experience is not required and parents do not need to know the language.
- Students with previous Spanish language experience may start the Spanish Bilingual program at other grade levels. In the case of an alternate entry point, parents will reach out to the school directly to arrange an appointment for language assessment for suitable placement.



#### **Taught in Spanish**

Spanish 50 % (Spanish Language Arts, Mathematics, and across other subject areas through an interdisciplinary approach) K-6



English 50% (English Language Arts, and across other subject areas through an interdisciplinary approach)



Spanish 30-\*35% (Spanish Language Arts, and other subjects to be determined by school)

Grades 7-9

English 65-\*70% (English Language Arts, Other subjects to be determined by school)



Spanish 20-\*25% (Spanish program requires 25 credits (Spanish Language Arts and other subjects to be determined by school)

Grades 10-12

\*International Spanish Academy

English 75-80%

### **Timeline for Registration**

- Registration will begin mid-January for the 2025-26 school year
- Closed noon on Tuesday before Teachers' Convention (February 11, 2025, noon)
- Lottery drawn on Wednesday before Teachers' Convention (February 12, 2025, noon)
- Results of the lottery draw sent within 10 business days of the draw
- Parents must accept/decline within 10 business days from the date of the acceptance letter

#### Alternative Programs | Expression of Interest

Below is the process for submitting an Expression of Interest for a school not in lottery. This process applies to students currently enrolled in kindergarten to Grade 8. Students currently enrolled and in Grades 9 to 11 must follow the High School Transfer Process.



### **Transportation Considerations**

- K-5 yellow bus transportation provided following CBE congregated stop guidelines for alternative programs
- transportation for grades 6-9 may be offered through congregated yellow bus stops or Calgary Transit (no rebates are provided)
- parents pay an annual fee for CBE yellow bus service or purchase monthly Calgary Transit passes
- Congregated stops are reviewed annually and informed by pre-registration for transportation, online through MyCBE/PowerSchool
- Congregated stops may not be within walking distance and alternate arrangements may be required to access the congregated stop

Additional Costs may be incurred for Field Trips







# Transportation (cont'd)

#### **Morning Kindergarten**

The bus will pick up your child from their assigned bus stop to bring them to school and you will be responsible for picking them up at the end of the morning.

#### Afternoon Kindergarten

You are responsible for getting your child to school and the bus will drop them off at their assigned bus stop at the end of the school day.

An adult must be present at the bus stop for kindergarten drop-offs or pick-ups.







### Kindergarten

Parents will be asked at registration if they have a preference for morning or afternoon Kindergarten. Priority for PM will be given to community students.

The preference is for organizational purposes.

We are unable to accommodate requests for a specific teacher or classroom.

If there are more requests than we can accommodate for either AM or PM, we will organize community students in PM. We can only accept up to 46 students in AM.

Parents will be informed of their child's placement at the orientation meeting in May.

If you have no preference, please indicate this during your registration so we may group students accordingly.

It is also important that you complete the Welcome to Kindergarten Parent Viewpoint as this is used to balance classes.







# Noon Supervision Grade 1-6

Students who have lunch at school are supervised by Noon Supervisors.

For the 2024-25 school year, the fee was \$305








### When can I start Kindergarten?

- **■**Registration for the 2025-2026 school year begins Monday, Jan. 13, 2025.
- ■For the 2025 school year, you may register your child for kindergarten as long as they turn five years old on or before Dec. 31 of the school year they will be in kindergarten. For example, when registering for the 2025-26 school year, your child must turn five on or before Dec. 31, 2025.
- Our <u>Kindergarten Registration Guide</u> will assist you in ensuring you are prepared for every part of school registration.









### When can I start Grade One?

- Grade 1 Children must be at least six years old as of Dec. 31, 2025 to start Grade 1 in 2025-26.
  - All day



- -Received Alberta Teachers' Association, Calgary Public Teachers' Local 38 Awards for Elementary












### Glenmeadows School Learning Supports

Classroom Teachers and the School Learning Team initially address learning concerns. Further supports in assessment and identification of learning issues may be available through the Calgary Board of Education.

Students may qualify for speech/language/fine motor skills therapies through CBE specialists, Community Outreach of Pediatrics and Psychiatry in Education or Alberta Health Services.









### **EGS Learning Supports**

**School Supports**: Spanish visiting teachers, Educational Assistants, School Assistants, Noon Supervisors, Practicum student teachers (Teaching and Educational Assistants)

**English Additional Learners:** support is available to facilitate development of English language skills. Support provided is dependent upon student need.

**Special Needs:** students with an *Individual Program Plan* are supported by the teacher and Student Learning Team.

**CBE Supports**: Occupational, Physical & Speech Language Therapists, Psychologist and Technology support
